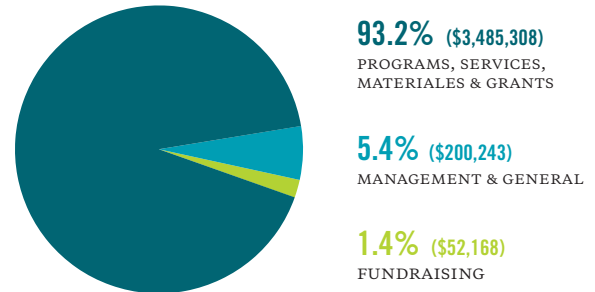

In 2017–2018 CAMO had the privilege of providing care and vital resources to people who are in need of access to quality health care and education. Adding two programs this year, we now have 18 medical programs, 2 educational programs, and send 66 Honduran medical brigades to rural villages to administer training and services. Since 1993 every CAMO program has incorporated the principles of sustainability, well before it became a watchword for NGO's and nonprofits. We are happy to report that CAMO earns Charity Navigator's 3-star rating, has a 6.4% administrative overhead, and is 76% self-supporting—expected to increase upward.

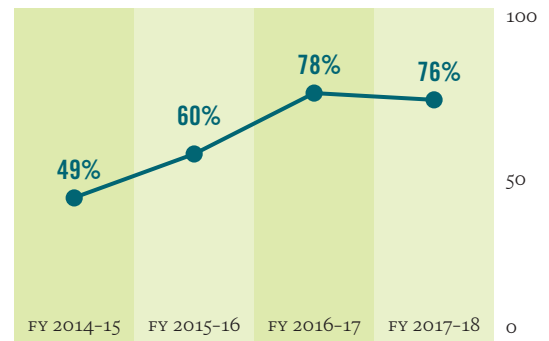

NEW NUTRITION PROGRAM

- opened in April 2018

- many are able to walk again
- 577 patients have now received care
