KEEPING HOPE ALIVE IN THE MIDDLE OF A PANDEMIC

FOR OVER 26 YEARS, WE HAVE BEEN PROVIDING, ON AVERAGE, MORE THAN 115,000 LIFE-SAVING SERVICES EACH YEAR TO IMPOVERISHED PEOPLE IN HONDURAS.

Our mission to bringing hope is made possible by a strong network of talented and dedicated staff and volunteers that includes health professionals, educators, biomedical engineers, logistic experts, etc. This year our job has been greatly impacted, but in the middle of the global COVID-19 pandemic we are adapting and creating new ways to deliver our services. Our Honduran team are creating innovative solutions for our changed circumstances.

On April 27th, after 40 days of staying home, our 52 Honduran employees returned to the offices. From the first day back in our facilities, we've ensured the safety and well being of our team by providing bio-security training as well as all the necessary PPE. On Mondays, two volunteer psychologists provide self-care sessions. We are taking care of our people so they can help us take care of others.

Our bio-med department has combined their knowledge and efforts to design and build sanitation tunnels that are now being donated to public hospitals and humanitarian institutions in Western Honduras. Our Education Department has been working non-stop to develop a biosecurity course for local companies. Meanwhile, our project management team keeps developing proposals to create synergies between the various institutions supported by CAMO. The Trade School will start sewing PPE such as gowns and masks; these will be distributed through INSSA. Our Honduran Board President Dr.Roberto Álvarez, alongside José Bautista, CAMO Honduras Executive Director, are part of the Municipal Emergency Council in Santa Rosa de Copán. This Council seeks to coordinate actions focused on the prevention of, attention to, the emergency response to the CoVid 19 in our region.

Please continue to pray for us and if you can support our efforts as during this crisis we are seeing 20,000 dollar deficit per month.
