We have completed our 27<sup>th</sup> year. Our success is due to you as our donor and to our 61 dedicated employees in HONDURAS and in the USA. The last two months of our fiscal year created many challenges as we faced a shutdown due to COVID. Pre COVID we were on track to generate 83% of our operational cost. We held at 79% self-supporting in HONDURAS. CAMO USA was able to supplement their loss and continue all services without suspending needed assistance.

## PROGRAMS YOUR DONATIONS HAVE HELPED GROW THIS YEAR

### MEDICAL SERVICES

- 48 dental and 10 medical brigades conducted using Honduran dental and medical counterparts and volunteers
- 6,059 patients treated in our new nutrition program

### MAINTENANCE

- 5 hospitals have been supported with mechanical ventilation, B-Pap and respiratory therapy supplies by our department in light of COVID-19
- 515 pieces of medical equipment have been donated this year already

### WOMEN'S HEALTH PROGRAMS

- Educational programs for women's health impacting up to 1,724 women in Santa Rosa
- 746 mammograms performed with 4 women having early detection and treatment of breast cancer

### SERVICES FOR DISABILITIES

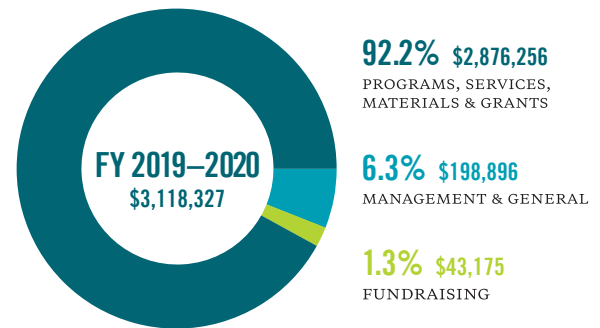
- Screening for child hearing problems at schools in 13 municipalities with treatment and hearing aids as needed
- Wheelchair drive conducted by Kidron Kars of Kidron, Ohio provided 55 wheelchairs.



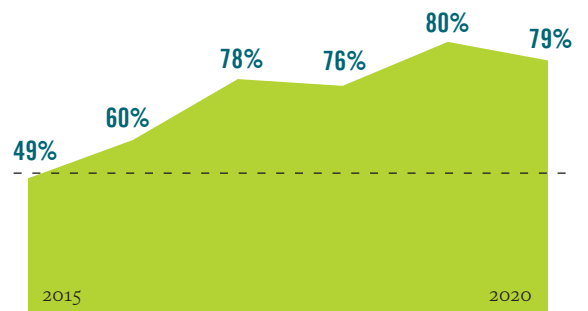
