During March, an ophthalmological brigade took place in which several patients with limited economic resources received surgeries to restore their vision. We are so grateful for the support of Dr. Kevin Waltz and John Delgado, who alongside Honduran medical doctors performed life-changing surgeries throughout the week.



CAMO's education program is providing a first aid/CPR skills training course for police officers in the department (state) of Copán in Honduras. It will equip those trained with the potentially life saving ability to assist an injured or ill person during a variety of emergency situations. Twenty police officers have already taken the course; in total 478 members will be trained by CAMO's education program (certified by the American Heart Association).

This family of three adults and five children have a grateful heart as they will no longer be sleeping on the streets after hurricanes Eta and Iota. They are the first family whose hope has been restored after receiving their temporary unit shelter. CAMO is also providing them with mattresses, latrines and a bucket of care containing basic survival needs.

## BUILDING HOPE: CAMO'S HURRICANE RELIEF PROJECT

IN RESPONSE TO THESE EPIC DISASTERS, CAMO HAS WORKED WITH CITIES' LEADERSHIP TO IDENTIFY FAMILIES WHOSE NEED FOR EMERGENCY AID IS URGENT; through this process, we have selected the families who will be receiving temporary unit shelters, mattresses, food, and basic survival items. A hurricane container with donated materials to build the shelters arrived at the worksite in Honduras on March 26th. Our staff in Honduras has been relocated to the worksites to prepare cement pads and footers for the shelters. In April 2021, the Municipality of El Progreso and a team from Goal International (USAID partner in Honduras), a nonprofit organization, joined our shelter project to assist with the construction of latrines.

We finished the model shelters last week and have now begun production of the shelters. We will be providing an estimated 468 shelters in all; at present, the project is focused on construction of the first 47 shelters for families who have already have cleaned their land-lot. Additionally, on March 26th, the Amapa Health Center in the community of El Progreso Yoro re-opened its doors; CAMO supported the community with cleanup, repairs, furnishings, medical equipment, and supplies. Since its re-opening, the health center is serving on average 30 patients of all different ages daily. This health center is serving on average 30 daily patients from all different ages.

We have met our goal of 1000 buckets of care, thanks to all the churches, service groups, individuals and volunteers. Meanwhile our programs in Honduras continue to operate and our services are being provided daily. We have dispatched two containers in April and have one more awaiting customs paperwork.
