CAMO's eye care program provides service to low income families. Our program focus is on prevention of blindness. Since June 25, CAMO's eye care program team has been conducting brigades for early detection of glaucoma. So far, 55 patients from the communities of San Pedro Copán and La Unión Copán have been treated. In total, 7 rural communities will benefit from these brigades.



CAMO continues to provide PPE and other consumables to Hospital de Occidente in Santa Rosa de Copan. Our warehouse staff in the USA and Honduras are constantly providing much-needed donations to the COVID-19 ward. These donations include oxygen and support supplies for patients on mechanical ventilation.

THE BUCKETS OF CARE HAVE ARRIVED!

ON JUNE 22ND, CAMO HONDURAS RECEIVED THE CONTAINER WITH THE BUCKETS OF CARE FULL OF BASIC SURVIVAL NEEDS. During that same week, CAMO HONDURAS staff traveled to the areas affected by hurricanes Eta and Iota in El Progreso Yoro to deliver the buckets of care to some of the homes you have made possible. As of July 1, 2021, we have completed 171 concrete pads and 81 shelters; 400 Buckets of Care have arrived and 600 more are on the way. 300 mattresses have arrived and are being given to each family on completion of their family unit. Cost per shelter is \$1,200. We have 439 families receiving shelters and will complete the project by the end of 2021 (assuming there are no more hurricanes!).

Jose Bautista, CAMO HONDURAS Director, along with other staff members spent three days in El Progreso Yoro delivering the buckets of care and mattresses to the families. They traveled through muddy roads to get to the villages most highly affected by the Hurricanes. These were hard working days with little rest, but highly fulfilling after seeing each family with a big smile and tears of joy in their eyes after receiving the bucket of care containing sheets, towels, plates, and cooking utensils that all of you donated. Each family has made their shelter so cozy with their few belongings and were so excited to add the new ones. Many explained that this was the first donation they ever received after losing everything due to the hurricanes. Their gratitude was real and heartwarming and we are reminded of why we serve. To hear their stories is a testimony of human spirit and strength. Thank you again to all our kind donors and volunteers:
