RECENT ACTIVITIES



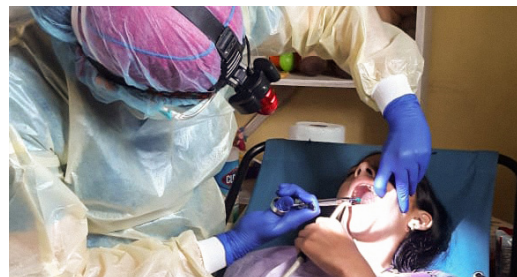

Our dental brigades are back! Beginning in July, after a year without brigades (due to the pandemic), we are finally able to restore this vital service to children and adults without access to dental care. On Tuesdays and Thursdays, our team now travels to villages in Western Honduras.



Thanks to valuable pledges from CAMO's Literacy program committee, we were able to advance the purchase of textbooks to include the 5th and 6th grade this year. Total costs were \$29,000, and we still need \$7,300 to complete payment. Our literacy program includes 13 rural schools and impacts 1,208 children in all.

Every dollar raised will greatly impact the people that CAMO serves. The past year has been the most challenging Honduras has faced in decades, with rising COVID cases, vaccine shortages, and continuous rebuilding from Hurricanes Eta and Iota. All of this is on top of the dire needs for medical care, safety, education, and surviving poverty. Despite the difficulties, our 22 programs continue to provide care daily. Annually, we see more than 109,00 patients—and as of September 9, in response to the recent natural disasters, we have built 281 family housing units for those who lost everything. In total, we will provide 439 family housing units for these families, along with mattresses and buckets of care filled with provisions. During our visits, these families' smiles are given freely, and their hope, joy, and faith are in plain view. They are so very grateful for everything they have received.
