A NEW YEAR FULL OF RENEWED HOPE

LAST YEAR AT THIS TIME WE WERE FINDING DISPLACED FAMILIES WITH NOWHERE TO GO. Their belongings were gone, their ability to provide for their families destroyed by the shutdown and hurricanes. Thousands of people were homeless, sleeping next to the river, afraid of having their children attacked by snakes. On top of that, many heads of the family lost their jobs at the farms due to the floods. Such was the case of Josuè Ezequiel Amaya who once felt hopeless but now is sleeping in a safe place with his family.

"With the passing of hurricanes Eta and Iota, I not only lost my house but I also lost the job that helped me feed my family. Building a new home seemed impossible for me. Now, it is such a relief to see my children sleeping in a safe place. Thank you, from the bottom of my heart, to everyone who helped me build a safe home for my family." - Josuè Ezequiel Amaya

Twelve months later, all that has changed for 427 families with the completion of housing units for each of them. This life-changing project consisted of cement floor housing units, latrines, and mattresses, along with provisions of sheets, towels, plates, cups, frying pans, personal care items and food for all the families. To date, only 15 family unit shelters remain to be built. To ensure a healthy environment, CAMO also cleaned up and replaced infrastructure in the public health center. We also provided medical equipment and supplies along with training the medical staff. Thirty patients per day are seen at this facility.

CAMO staff worked daily to manage this project, traveling for five hours to reach the destination. On our latest visit, while we were walking through the heat and muddy roads to get to the shelters, we could see and feel people's renewed hopes to continue working hard for their dreams that were once shattered by the hurricanes.

Despite the difficulties that CAMO encountered after the pandemic, we continue to change lives. Thanks to our dedicated staff, donors, volunteers, and partnerships, we will be able to finish another project that will have a profound impact on many families. We would like to give a special thank you to the many churches who decided to join our cause. Thank you to our national and international donors and partners for all your support.
