CAMO PROGRAMS



Due to a lack of economic resources and access to health services, people are hopelessly at home suffering pain and becoming dependent on the rest of the family. Our general practitioners evaluated Nazario, a patient who had endured migraines and eye pain for four months. Nazario was immediately referred to the CAMO Ophthalmology Program, where specialists provided the appropriate treatment. Nazario is now back with his family migraine free. Nazario is one of many cases we find during our brigades to the rural areas.



Vanessa was diagnosed with hydrocephalus at birth. The CAMO Neurosurgery Program treated her at the Hospital de Occidente. Thanks to the neuroendoscopic surgery, Vanessa continues to be her family's joy and receives follow-up evaluation by Dr. Álvarez.



Fifty families living in extreme poverty from 10 different municipalities received a bucket of food along with nutritional assessment, treatment, and education provided by our team of nutritionists. Our team will revisit each family to deliver new food rations and make an evaluation to measure the impact. Thanks to Harvest Call for the donated food rations.



Noemí is in the first grade. As a result of her hearing problems, she was struggling at school. However, thanks to the CAMO Integrated Education and Health Program's brigades she received care and her school performance improved. These brigades tackle children's learning obstacles caused by eye, dental, hearing, and nutritional problems. This year more than 1,200 children from 16 rural schools will be served with our 138 brigades.
