CAMO'S ONGOING MIRACLES

THE MIRACLES OF THE SEEING AND COMFORTABLY BREATHING

María first appeared at the Ophthalmology social program facilities at CAMO in April of this year. Back in October 2021, Maria started a vision screening process in the city of Tegucigalpa, visiting ophthalmologists and performing several tests, which resulted in a diagnosis of eye cancer and a prognosis of total loss of vision. María was forced to resign herself to being able to see with only one eye. In March, new exams indicated a macular hole - but María could not continue the treatment, because there was no longer an ophthalmologist in the Tegucigalpa hospital, only in private clinics, and Doña María could not afford the fees for a private doctor. Through social networks, the patient learned about CAMO and scheduled an appointment with us. CAMO ophthalmologists reviewed María's records and recommended surgery. After undergoing PHACO Vitrectomy, María is now in the process of recovering her sight; she has been doing very well, gradually regaining her vision. The patient is very grateful for the treatment provided through CAMO's ophthalmology staff and the medical team. The ophthalmology social program offers 4,102 services and treats 4,060 patients a year.



Raúl was born with a chronic respiratory spinal dystrophy; he visits the hospital often due to his severe respiratory condition. His father, who makes his living working in the fields, does not earn enough money to provide for his son's medical condition. CAMO provided Raul with a C-pap Resmed and other supplies, so that Raul can receive his respiratory treatment more comfortably at home. During the last year, CAMO has supported 1,970 patients with medical supplies and equipment to enable them to continue home treatments.

CAMO PROGRAMS



Wilmer lives in a village outside Santa Rosa, he fell off a tree while he was working; now paralyzed, he has been confined to his home for almost two years. CAMO's volunteer doctor did a home visit it was decided to bring him back to the foundation where we upgraded his wheelchair and he also was placed in the care of two of our other programs of nutrition and psychology. The wheelchair program has helped more than 700 people last year.



CAMO has been donating prenatal vitamins to the various municipalities surrounding the city. These vitamins will not only help newborn children's health and early development, but also improve the mother's ability to provide sustenance for her baby. A total of 38 public health clinics were supplied last year with 7,938 complete treatments donated to pregnant women.



CAMO's general practitioners are providing First Aid Workshops to all our staff who care for patients on a daily basis, with the goal of preparing them for each scenario that arises so they can act accordingly.



Thanks to Dr. Tabet's donation, CAMO is carrying out a sewer project in the Girl's Orphanage. We are replacing the hydro-sanitary system and the rainwater system of the orphanage to avoid any contamination problems and improve the living conditions of the girls.
