This October, a magical twinkling in her eyes could be seen as she received a new prosthetic leg specially made for her at our Orthotic and Prosthetic lab. Now she can go back to running, dancing, and playing with her friends!

Despite going through many hardships at such a young age, Angelly is a girl full of life and charisma. The day she received her prosthetic leg, she immediately started dancing and wouldn't stop thanking God and hugging our lab team of Santos and Vanessa. Her joy was so contagious, and she shared these words with us: "All my challenges tasted bitter, but now my victory tastes sweet as honey."
