

# STARTING A NEW YEAR FULL OF STORIES THAT WARM UP OUR HEARTS AND RENEW OUR HOPES

Unlike the USA, there is no Social Security, Medicare, drug, or supplemental hospitalization plan for the elderly. Oscar worked all his life and he depends on the public health system which never has the medication or services he requires.

Oscar and his wife María Domitila are a senior couple that radiates kindness, and joy with their smiles. For 12 years, Oscar worked as a security guard at the Hospital de Occidente, located half a block from the CAMO Facility in Honduras. He has diabetes, and it saddens us to learn his illness had never been treated. For a long time, he suffered from diabetes, not feeling well, increasing pain, and foot ulcers. By October of the previous year, his foot ulcer made his mobility impossible he could no longer bare the pain. He remembered watching patients come and go daily to our doors. With no money, and no options from the public system he and his wife knocked on our doors. For this reason, CAMO Honduras provides a Diabetic Clinic one day a week ran by our counterpart Dr. Bladimir Irías. Without hesitation, Dr. Irias provided support, and on a Wednesday Oscar just attended his fifth appointment to continue receiving medical attention. His ulcer is fully cured and we are providing him with support. He also will be joining the Diabetic Club to keep control of his diabetes.

Oscar's wife was also experiencing health problems. She presented discomfort in her stomach and was treated in our gastroenterology program. She had an endoscopy and now is under follow-up treatment.

Only by church support and individual donation can we continue to help those who are truly forgotten. We continue to be grateful for being able to serve so many.
