THE IMPACT OF THE CAMO MODEL

On a recent Sunday morning at 3:00 am, a bus carrying 70 Venezuelan, Colombian, and Cuban immigrants drove off a bridge and into a river just outside of Santa Rosa de Copan, Honduras. Later that morning Kathy Tschiegg, founder of CAMO, received news about the accident. Four passengers had died, twenty were transported to a nearby hospital, but many others remained at the site needing medical attention.

Thankfully this wasn't an ordinary Sunday for Kathy and the CAMO Honduras staff. The day before, twenty U.S. volunteers arrived in Santa Rosa for the Fall Medical Brigade, including Emergency Department Doctor Rosalia Mahr, RNs Monica Coventry and Megan Frank, and Respiratory Therapist Jackie Williams (all who are highly experienced in first aid care). Within 15 minutes of receiving the call requesting help, the CAMO staff had boxes of medication and supplies from the warehouse and additional Honduran medical personnel ready to accompany the US team to the crash site.

The Honduran and US teams had never worked together before and also had limited information about the severity of the accident. They mentally prepared for the worst and hoped for the best as they arrived at a riverside hotel where the victims were resting. Within 30 minutes, they organized the outdoor patio space into areas for triage, wound care, and ultrasounds then began evaluating and treating children and adults for abdominal trauma, wounds, fractures, and neck pain.

Assistant Director of CAMO USA, Rachel Foltz, recounts, "It was amazing to see the collaboration between the US and Honduran volunteers. CAMO was prepared with all of the needed supplies and despite the chaos and uncertainty, this team remained calm and professional. Many other organizations arrived after us to provide food and clothing to the families. Throughout the week CAMO continued to provide follow-up care to these patients who were extremely grateful for our effort to care for them."
