The Innocence of Christmas

We've all seen those remarkable moments when animals care for one another—when the most unlikely creatures unite in simple acts of love and protection. There's something profoundly pure in those gestures, something that reminds us of the innocence of a child.

Christmas, at its heart, is about that same innocence—when a child bore the burden of humanity and brought light into a world shadowed by pain.

This year, I'm reminded of that light through the story of Nohemi. Only three years old, she arrived at the doors of our shelter holding tightly to her mother's hand. Both had been beaten and were trembling with fear, seeking refuge. Despite her age, Nohemi was her mother's protector. She could sense, even before anyone else, when an epileptic seizure was about to strike. Gently, she would make her way to the shelter's staff to warn them.

Soon we discovered that little Nohemi was blind. Through the combined compassion of CAMO and the Robles Eye Clinic, her sight was restored. Her mother received the medical care and support she so desperately needed, and together, they began a new life free from abuse. Today, Nohemi lives with her aunt in a safe and loving home, surrounded by stability and care.

This Christmas, may we pause to remember the power of innocence—the quiet, unguarded love that changes lives.

May the purity of a child's heart soften our own, transforming fear into hope, and pain into compassion.

Let us become, each in our own way, bearers of light in a world that still needs it so deeply.
