

## Support That Becomes Perseverance

In 2003, when many had lost hope, CAMO chose to believe. To believe in a forgotten space, in worn-down walls, and in a gym where no one else saw a future. CAMO saw something different: a place where thousands of children could dream, grow, and learn to persevere through sports.

More than 20 years after rebuilding the Community Center & Gym in Santa Rosa de Copán, that decision continues to bear fruit. Today, nearly 500 children, youth, and their families celebrate not only athletic achievements, but powerful stories of effort, commitment, and resilience.

For the fifth consecutive year, the Perseverance Awards were held to honor those who refuse to give up. This special edition was dedicated to Kathy Tschiegg, CAMO's founder and international director—a woman widely recognized for her tireless dedication and unwavering commitment to vulnerable communities.

The fifth edition of the Perseverance Awards recognized athletes from various disciplines who train daily at the Community Center & Gym and have excelled in local, national, and international competitions. Among them are young athletes who have become a source of pride for Santa Rosa de Copán, such as Diana Bobadilla, honored for her excellence in chess.


The event brought together more than 500 children and youth, accompanied by their parents, siblings, and loved ones, in a celebration that also acknowledged the quiet but essential work of coaches, staff, and leaders who sustain this place of hope every day.

Over the past year, thanks to more than \$20,000 in donations from individuals and institutions in the United States, CAMO equipped the Community Center & Gym with exercise machines and sports gear, benefiting approximately 600 daily users and creating opportunities for discipline, community, and hope.
