A Legacy on 64 Squares

In Santa Rosa de Copán, Diana discovered that chess is more than a game—it is purpose.

At just 15 years old, Diana is the youngest national chess champion in Honduras. But her story does not begin with trophies; it begins with heritage. Her grandfather taught her father, and her father taught her. Three generations connected through a chessboard, building a legacy that continues to grow beyond the game itself.

Diana started playing chess when she was three years old and began competing internationally by the age of 7. Behind every move is discipline: she trains seven days a week, studies every game, and constantly pushes herself beyond natural talent.

That journey found a defining place: the Community Gym in Santa Rosa de Copán, completed by CAMO in 2004 and still maintained today through CAMO's ongoing partnership and support.

"The gym is a key part of my life. I train here and I have grown in chess... but it is also a space where many children are learning and moving forward." Today, Diana is a national champion, a Candidate Master (a title earned in the countries of Trinidad and Tobago), and has competed in Colombia, Puerto Rico, and the United States. She will soon represent Honduras at the Chess Olympiad in Uzbekistan.

"It feels amazing to represent my country... but also my city and the gym." But her story goes far beyond competition.

Diana now trains younger children, sharing what she has learned. She encourages them to focus, believe in themselves, and see chess as an opportunity for growth. She dreams of becoming a FIDE Master, a Grand Master—and also an architect. To create, design, and build, just as she does in every game she plays. Her journey is proof that where mentorship and opportunities exist, talent can flourish.

CAMO did not only rebuild a gym—it helped build a future.

And with continued support, many more stories like Diana's are just beginning.

Together with our partners Danilo's Care and donors in the United States, we delivered 1,700 school kits to students across nearly 30 schools in Honduras. Each kit provides the essentials to write, learn, and grow, offering dignity and the tools needed to develop their minds every day.



Early detection saves lives, yet many women still lack access to screening. On Cervical Cancer Prevention Day, CAMO joined Hospital de Occidente and Dr. Jorge Romero to provide 250 free screenings, advancing care and awareness for women who need timely, life-saving prevention and treatment.



In recent CAMO medical and dental brigades, 1,332 services were provided in ophthalmology, general medicine, gynecology, audiometry, dentistry, and pediatrics. Volunteers reached two remote communities with no care access, and five more communities remain scheduled for upcoming specialized outreach brigades.
