When she has only a little, she splits it in two

At eight years old, a fifth-grade student at Esteban Guardiola Elementary School in Triunfo de la Cruz, Tela, already understands what it means to go without. When she sees a classmate with nothing to eat, she shares what little she has because, as she simply says, "they are hungry."

She is one of 38 children at the school who have lost a mother, a father, or both. For many, grief has been followed by another struggle: not enough food, clothing, or school supplies, and sometimes the loss of a stable home.

One young girl recently lost her mother to dengue and now lives with family friends. Still, she dreams of becoming a nurse. Another lost the brother who had been caring for her and her three siblings. She dreams of becoming a veterinarian and caring for the marine life of Tela.

Their teacher, Danixa Contreras, sees their struggles every day. "They are children who deserve love and need food and education," she says. "Sometimes, the only thing they eat is the snack they receive at school."

CAMO and World Vision responded with food, dental kits, and toys, but the need goes much deeper.

On September 18, Salsa Sizzle will help us respond. Our goal is to raise \$100,000 to ship 10 containers to Honduras. These containers carry supplies and equipment that support CAMO's educational, medical, and community programs, helping care for these children and many other children and adults throughout Honduras.

Many of these children might not be facing life without a parent if timely medical care had been available to their mothers and fathers.

For a child who has already lost so much, even a small act of compassion can carry a powerful message:

You are seen. You are loved. You are not forgotten.
